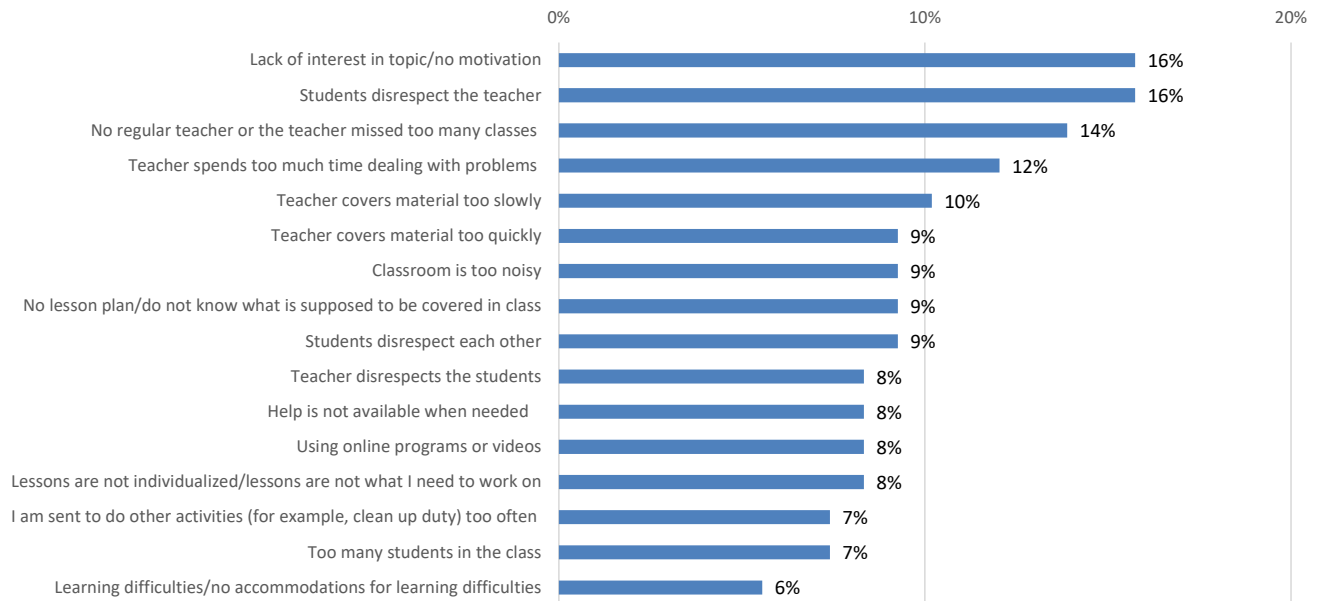

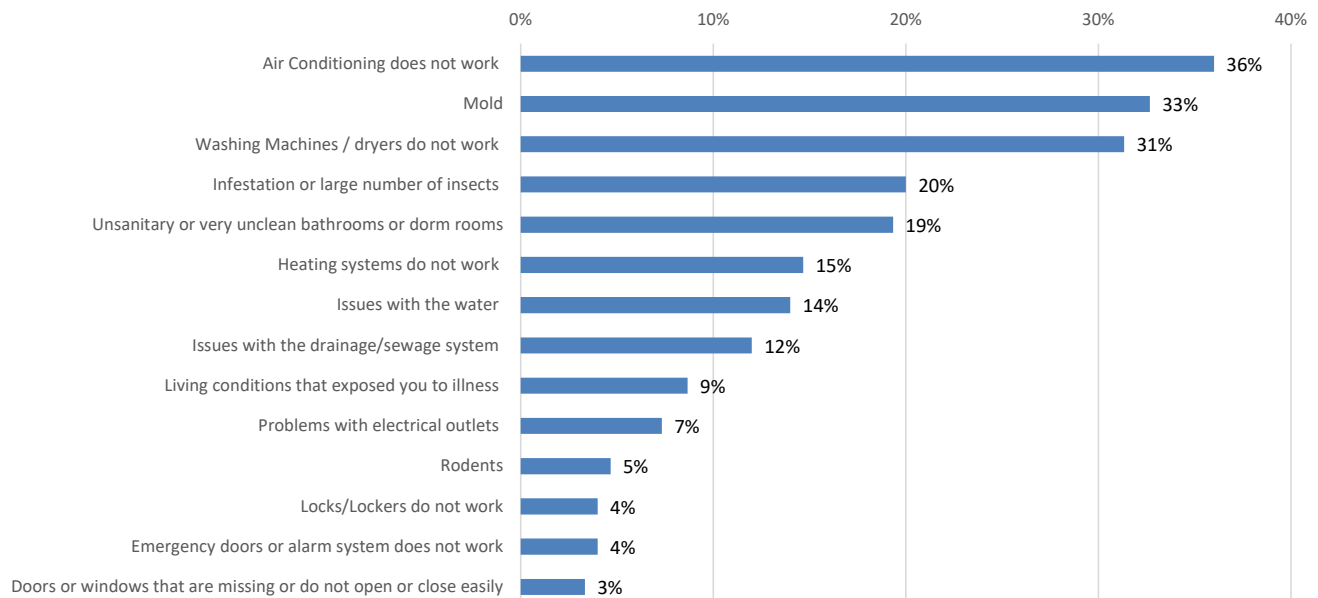

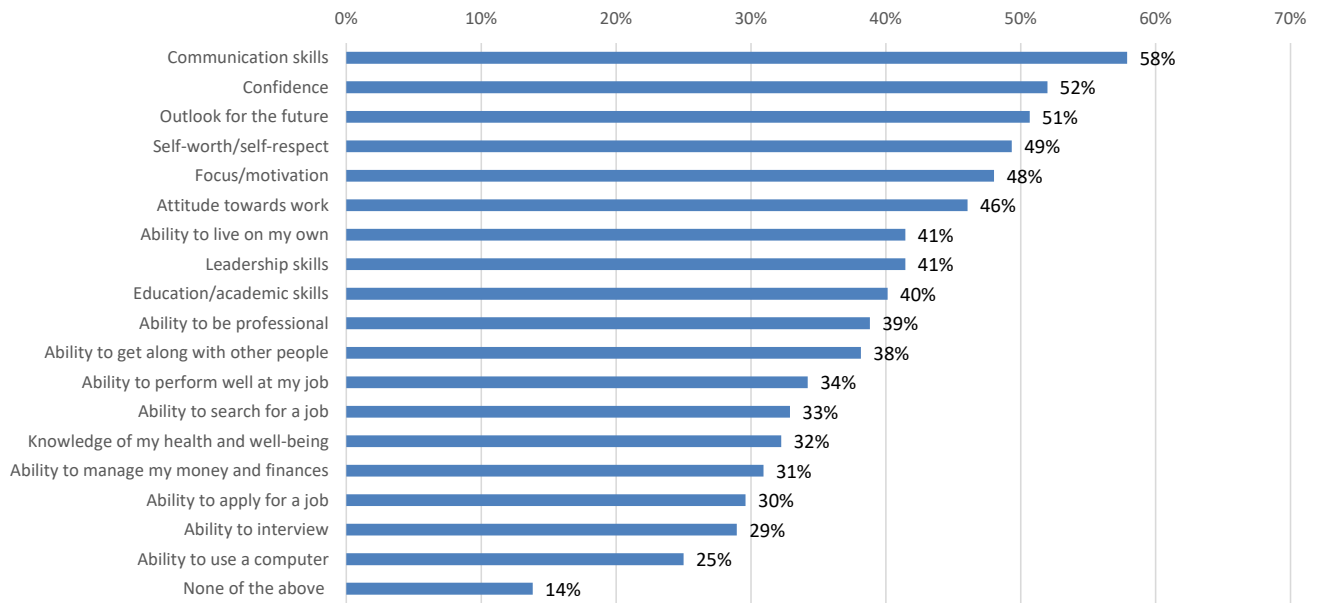
Causes for Difficulties in Math Class



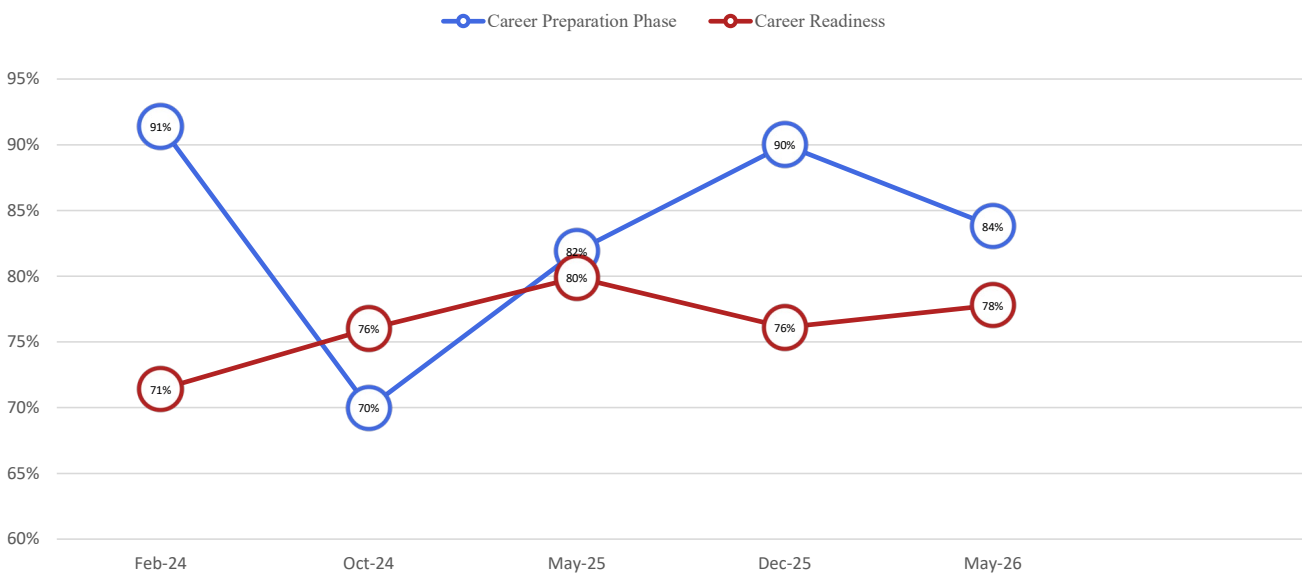
Dorm Safety Issues



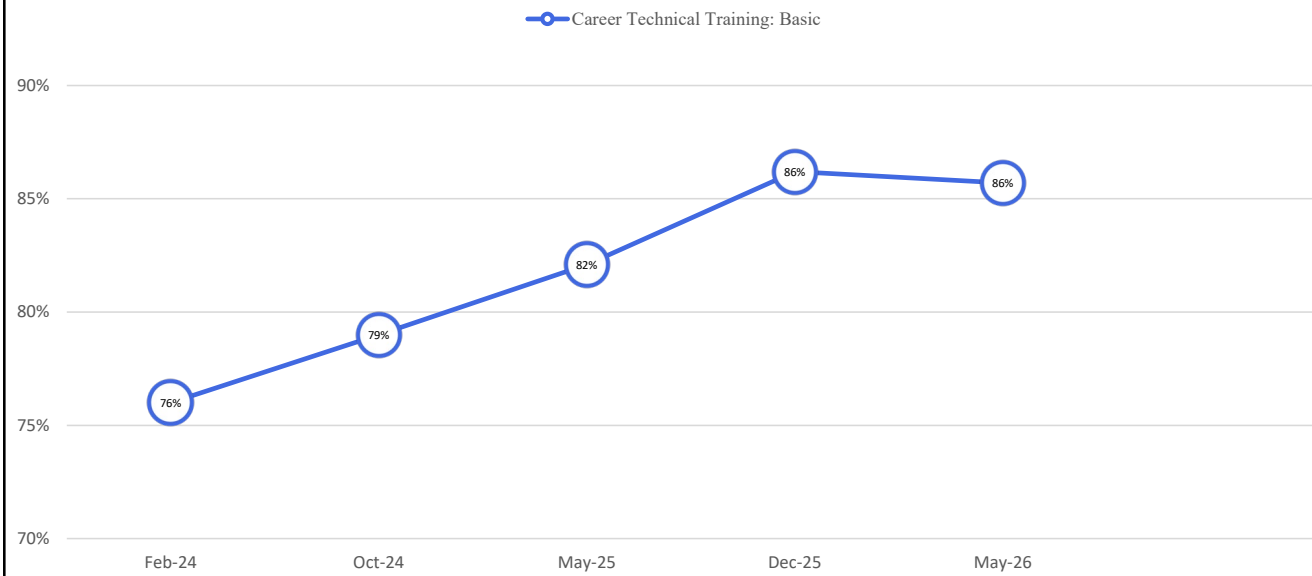
Job Corps Improved my Skills



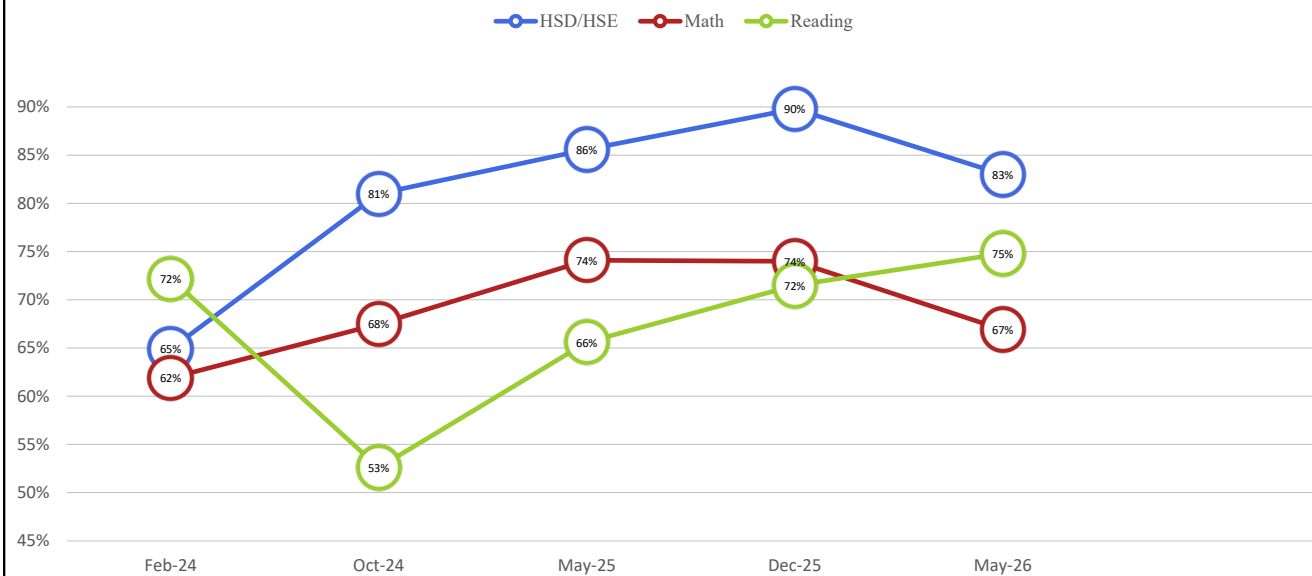
Career Success - Percent Agree



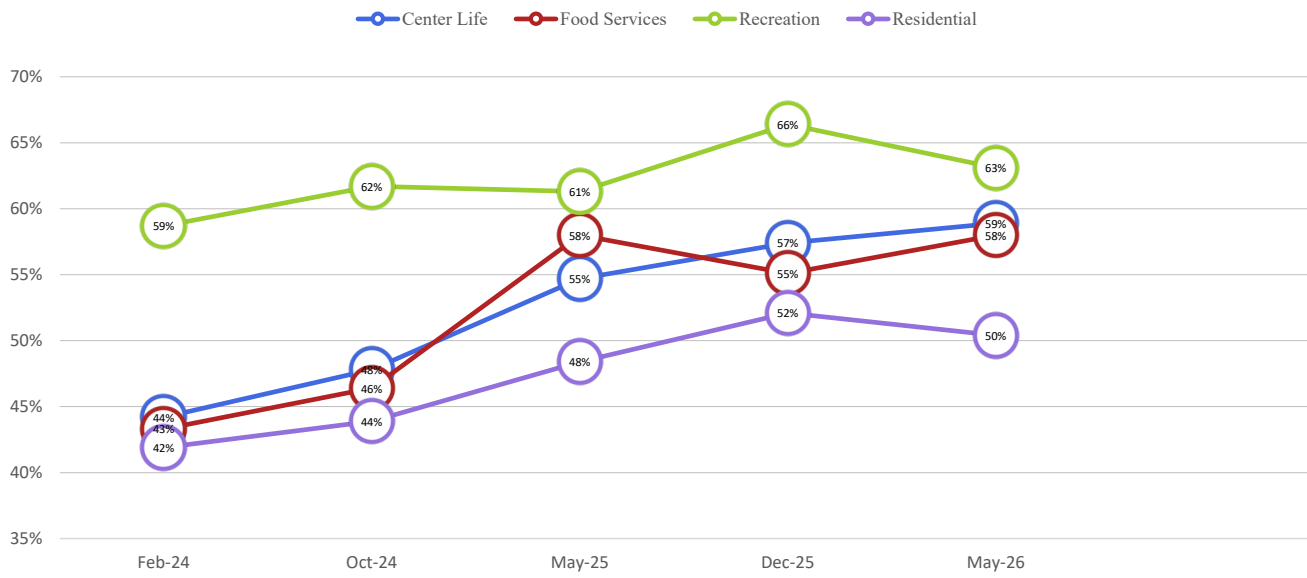
Career Technical Training - Percent Agree



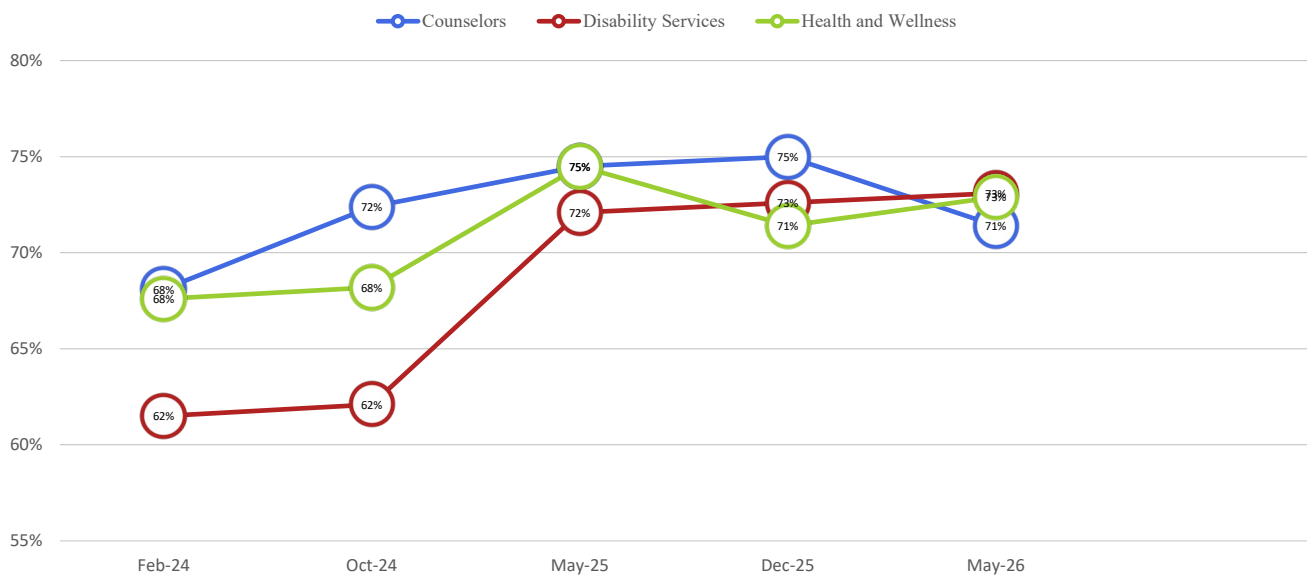
Academics - Percent Agree
